ROCK CHALLENGE



The pupils enjoyed creating their own recipes using the produce available, as well as tasting to see if more seasoning was required before finally allowing it to be served. They also took into consideration any dietary requirements that staff members had. Year 6 Volcano Art

Year 6 pupils were in the art room this week to work on some paintings in connection with their topic work about volcanoes. We started off experimenting with different colours of temperapaste using palette knives to create the texture of volcanic rock. Next we applied acrylic paint to form the lava exploding over the painting in vibrant colours. For the finishing touches, pupils could choose to add volcanic ash, using round sponges to achieve the effect of the ash clouds and tissue paper to add dimension to their lava.
