Personal Development

This week we have launched our second round of personal development. This involves all children taking responsibility for their school environment. Each child will take on a role to improve and contribute to their school. There are lots of jobs on offer such as eco warriors, Head of School PA. Performing Arts assistant and Travel Trackers. The children have taken full ownership of this and it is great to see them fully immerse into their school and their job roles.

KS3 Maths

In Year 7 Maths, we are coming to the end of our study of negative numbers. We have discussed why negative numbers are so complicated (unlike counting numbers, like 1, 2, 3, 4 etc., you can never actually 'see' a negative quantity; you can't say, "Hey, look, this is negative 4"). We discussed how negative numbers can be best seen on number lines and have used these to add and subtract values that crossed the zero boundary. We have studied the ideas of adding and subtracting negative values. Year 8 have begun their new topic focusing on algebra skills. Our lessons so far have used the skills of substituting values into algebraic expressions, simplifying expressions by collecting like terms and expanding brackets. Next week solving algebraic equations!
