Learners will know:

- ✓ Writers use irony and satire to convince the reader of a certain point of view
- Empathetic writing can be used to manipulate the emotions of the reader
- ✓ Irony is the expression of one's meaning by using language that normally signifies the opposite, typically for humorous or emphatic effect
- ✓ Satire is the use of humour, irony, exaggeration, or ridicule to expose and criticize people's stupidity or vices, particularly in the context of contemporary politics and other topical issues
- ✓ Empathy is the ability to understand and share the feelings of another

Non Fiction:

- ✓ Persuasive arguments analysis –
- ✓ Arguments are evidence based and evidence is quoted to underpin arguments
- ✓ Powerful and precise language is used to manipulate the reader's emotions
- ✓ Include a call for a judgement to be made (right or wrong, good or bad)
- ✓ Rhetorical devices are used to persuade or subtly influence the reader
- ✓ Anaphora is repetition of words or phrases at the beginning of sentences and is used for emphasis

Language:

- ✓ Colons for emphasis
- ✓ Emphasis on key words (italics, underlining, bold) to highlight the importance to the reader
