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Getting off to a good start

Mobile phones can be brought to school. They need to be switched off whilst on the school site. They must be handed into your tutor during morning registration where they will be stored in a box safely and placed in the office. These will be returned to you at the end of lesson 5.

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Uniform

This is important to us as it ensures you are all treated fairly and feel equal. Uniform standards are checked daily, and we expect to see:

- ✓ White collared shirts always tucked in with blue clip-on tie
- ✓ Skirts or shorts to the knee or grey tailored trousers
- ✓ Smart black school shoes (no trainers of any type)
- ✓ Plain grey or black socks or tights (no leggings)
- ✓ BMS V neck jumper
- ✓ Discreet subtle makeup
- ✓ Nail polish to be clear – no fake nails
- ✓ Piercings – in the ears only and must be plain, flat studs
- ✓ Watches must not have internet facility
- ✓ No rings, anklets, bracelets or necklaces
- ✓ Hair neat and tidy and tied back throughout the entire day

PE Kit

Only to be worn on PE days or if you have an after-school sports club or UBC. No large brands or logos on any clothing.

- ✓ Shorts - black cycling shorts to the knee or football style shorts to mid mid-thigh

We love it when you say, “good morning” and “goodbye” when you see staff on the gate 😊

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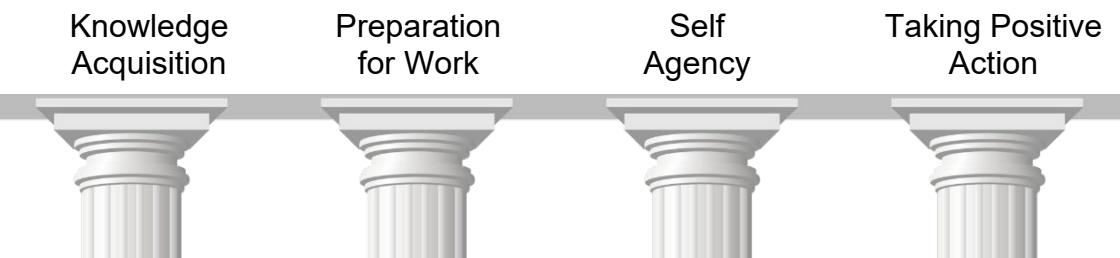


Key Learning Books

You will need your **Key Learning Book** every lesson. You will use this to make notes to help with your home learning as it will always link to what have done in lessons. You will also be provided with QR codes to direct you to websites that will help you. Over a two-week period, you are expected to complete a total of ten pieces of homework. Eight of these will be written in your Key Learning book and should represent approximately 30 minutes of home learning. You will also be set a weekly Maths Sparx session by your Maths teacher. An example of a home learning schedule could be:

We also offer homework support after school and at lunchtime.

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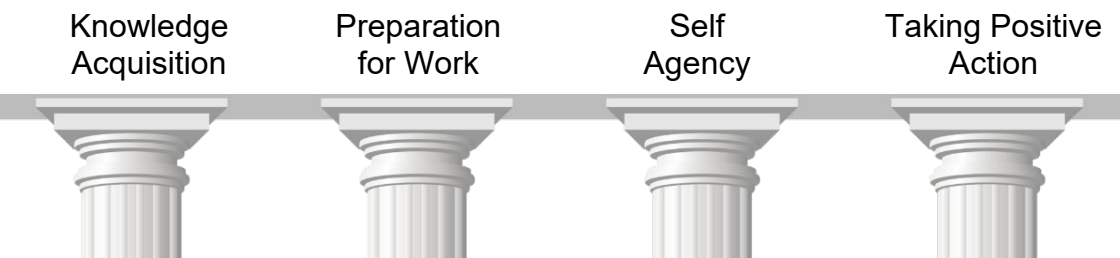
