



Year 7 Catch Up Grant 2016-17

At Broadstone Middle School, we are committed to ensuring that learners who did not reach their expected standard at the end of Key Stage Two, take part in additional targeted intervention in order to boost their rate of progress and catch up with their peers.

The year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2). Broadstone Middle will receive £17,280 in funding for 2016/17.

School Context

The recent changes to the whole school structure, we believe will improve attainment and progress for all children. In particular, we have been able to timetable specialist teachers in KS3 by rearranging the timings of the day. In addition to this, the creation of departments increases accountability. A new tracking process is in place with challenging targets. Systems are in place for easy identification of pupils not making expected progress. Rigorous self-review and quality assurance processes are in place.
